

John Adams introduced our guest speaker, Dr. Charles Bullock, an insider of national and Georgia politics. Dr Bullock highlighted his ties to DeKalb County as a native of Tucker and his personal history with Decatur Rotary. Dr. Bullock's grandfather was a member

of Tucker Rotary and would make-up absences with Decatur Rotary.

Dr. Bullock began his review of national and local politics with a wish for the new year - the commencement of the federal fiscal year. Nationally he says, Republicans will have a very good year in the 2010 elections following a pattern that a party will lose Congressional seats in the mid-term election after it wins the Presidency. The bad economy adds to this historical pattern, as voters will cast their ballot against the President's party as a vote of disapproval and unhappiness, Dr. Bullock explains. While Congress has been active, its' actions have mainly been unpopular with the American public from bailouts, health care and immigration. Americans believe that the nation is on the wrong track by a ratio of two to one. There is also an enthusiasm gap where the Republicans are excited and the Democrats are unhappy about the upcoming elections. This enthusiasm is traced to the general upswing in the number of Republican ballots cast, as compared to 1990 per Dr. Bullock.

Turning to Georgia, Dr. Bullock announced with confidence that Georgia is a Red State. However, the electoral outcome is dependent upon which voters show up on Election Day. In 2008, 3.9 million Georgians voted in the general election. Thirty percent of those voters were African-American. However, for the run-off only twenty-five percent of the voters were African-American. Democrats in Georgia may see good numbers if African-American voters return to the polls in numbers similar to 2008.

However, Democrats statewide face incredible odds. The last time a non-incumbent Democrat won statewide office in Georgia was 1998. Every Republican candidate for statewide office leads their Democratic opponent by wide margins (10 - 20 points). The contest for Governor is the

In the Governor's race, the Republican-nominee Nathan Deal continues to lead Democratic-nominee Roy Barnes, but only by 5-8 points. Dr. Bullock attributed the closer contest for Governor to the negatives of Deal.

Dr. Bullock concluded his analysis of national and state politics by encouraging every member of the Club to become educated on the issues/candidates and engage in the discourse, and especially to vote on November 3.
