We had one visiting Rotarian, our speaker **Sheila Tschinkel**.

hospitality suite, a constant at the District Conferences, was in full swing. Also, a group of Decatur Rotarians enjoyed a fine dinner last night in conjunction with the Conference.

President Bryan brought us three sad reports: first David Hughes father, Buddy, passed away last week. Second, Frank Carryl, one of our past Presidents, passed away earlier that day. Third, our fellow member Van Fraser has entered into the Hospice program and is not doing well at all. President Bryan encouraged us to all write notes of concern to the appropriate family members.

In the final segment before the program, **Stuart Zola** presented to us a brief report on his work at the Yerkes Primate Center. He informed us that even though these are tough economic times for research facilities, the Yerkes center is enjoying good financial success this last year with over 57 million dollars in sponsored research. Two main areas of this research are stroke prevention and intervention research, and transplant research. As usual for Stuart, he concluded his presentation with a magic trick which was enjoyed by all.

Jim Crabb then introduced our featured speaker Sheila Tschinkel, an economist and Rotarian from the Atlanta Club. Sheila presented the economic outlook, both long term and short term. She is more

optimistic about the short term than the long term. She says that in the long term, we have to reign in deficit spending....it simply cannot last. She pointed out that at present there is a lot of excess slack and capacity in our economy. She projects short term growth of around 3.5 percent. She feels that the stimulus spending by the government has helped to jump start the economy, however, while this helped in 2009, it is not the only thing responsible for the growth we have seen in 2010.

Ms.Tschinkel thinks growth will slow a bit in 2011. She noted that the unemployment we are experiencing is due to the depth and the duration of the recession. Another concern is that in the last 30 years, income distribution has altered dramatically: there has been huge growth at the top and the bottom of the range, and a hollowing out of the middle. An even distribution would be healthier. The housing bubble made folks think they were wealthier than they were, and they generated far more debt than they would have normally. As a result, Sheila does not anticipate consumer spending helping us anytime soon.

Sheila feels that in the long run, we have got to control Federal spending, and we have got to increase revenues by taxing. Also, in the long run, we have to fix the financial sector. She offered several measures to reform the sector, and said we have to figure out how to bring ethical, fair behavior into the mix. Ultimately, she does not think you can legislate this...you have to bring it about somehow in ways outside of legislation.
