increase in the frequency of large scale data breaches. Many of these cyber-security breaches have involved high-profile companies and organizations such as Target, Home Depot, Sony and the Mayo Clinic. In the first half of 2015, experts estimate that more than 117 million records have already been compromised.)

Oplogics, Mr. Warren's newest initiative, targets what he calls "the last mile" in security breaches. YOU are the last mile. To protect yourself and your business, Oplogics training is aimed at raising awareness of potential risks and changing employee behaviors in the workplace to minimize those risks. Even with the best hardware and most up-to-date software, many companies remain vulnerable based on employee behavior. Here are some tips to protect yourself and your business from being victimized by a cyber-security breach:

- Be wary of urgent sounding emails phishing for information by demanding immediate response
- Be wary of emails that request sensitive data
- Hover over links before clicking to see if the URL looks legitimate
- Look for grammatical errors or misspellings in emails - these can be a sign of someone phishing
- Change your passwords frequently - at least two times per year
- Do not use unencrypted Wi-Fi networks
- Back up your computer regularly
- Keep your anti-virus software up-to-date
- Limit the personal information (like date of birth) you share on social media sites
