
In 2013, Peter Swire became the Nancy J. and Lawrence P. Huang Professor of Law and Ethics, at the Georgia Institute of Technology. He is a member of the faculty of the Scheller College of Business, with appointments by courtesy with the College of Computing and School of Public Policy. Previously, Swire was the C. William

O'Neill Professor of Law at the Ohio State University.

Swire is author of five books and numerous scholarly papers. He has testified often before the Congress, and been quoted regularly in the press.

Swire has served on privacy and security advisory boards for companies including Google, IBM, Intel, and Microsoft, and for eight years was a consultant with the global law firm of Morrison and Foerster, LLP.

Swire graduated from Princeton University, summa cum laude, and the Yale Law School, where he was an editor of the Yale Law Journal. Swire is author of five books and numerous scholarly papers. He has testified often before the Congress, and been quoted regularly in the press.

Consul General Aviran honored our Club with his presentation of "Israel, Hamas and the Middle East: The Israeli Perspective." Consul General Aviran has been a tireless advocate for strengthening the bonds between Israel and the United States in the fields of economics, academics, culture and politics.

Although the Israeli-Palestinian conflicts have continued for decades, Consul General Aviran focused on the current serious conflict between Israel and Hamas forces in the Gaza Strip, the longest conflict in 66 years. He stressed that Israel has the right to defend themselves against aggressors, and that their primary objective is to achieve peace for the people of Israel, despite the terrorist attacks they have suffered.


In retaliation during this conflict, Israel launched Operation Protective Edge at the Gaza Strip border, to combat Hamas rocket strikes and to destroy Hamas caves and tunnels at the border. The majority of Hamas's continuous rocket strikes were stopped by Israel's Iron Dome missile defense and early alert systems.

The Gaza Strip has suffered major damage during this conflict, and it will need significant reconstruction and humanitarian aid.

In conclusion, Consul General Aviran stressed the need for world leaders to respond to this serious conflict and assist Israel in their objective for

achieving peace.
